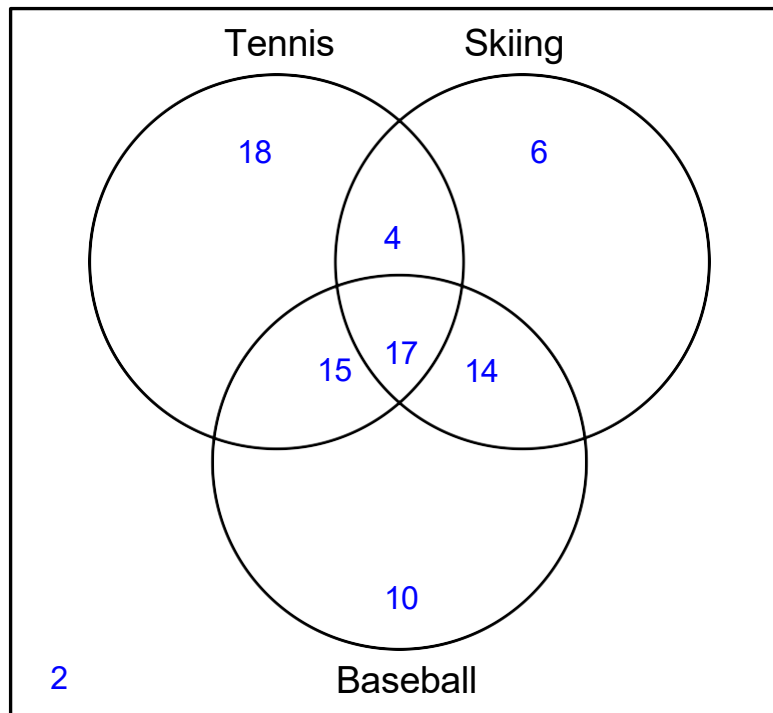

3	She misses her bus.	Inferred from the line: '...when she walked round the corner, her bus was already pulling away from the bus stop. Kelcey checked her watch, worried that she would be late.'
4	Walk	Inferred from the line: '...she would have to think of something else. Half an hour later, striding along in her smart shoes, Kelcey regretted her decision.'
5	It starts to rain.	Inferred from the line: '...Kelcey regretted her decision. All over the street, people were getting their umbrellas out.'
6	She won't get the job.	Inferred from the line: 'She imagined arriving not only considerably late but soaking wet as well. It really wasn't going to make a very good first impression at all... Was it even worth her turning up for the interview?'

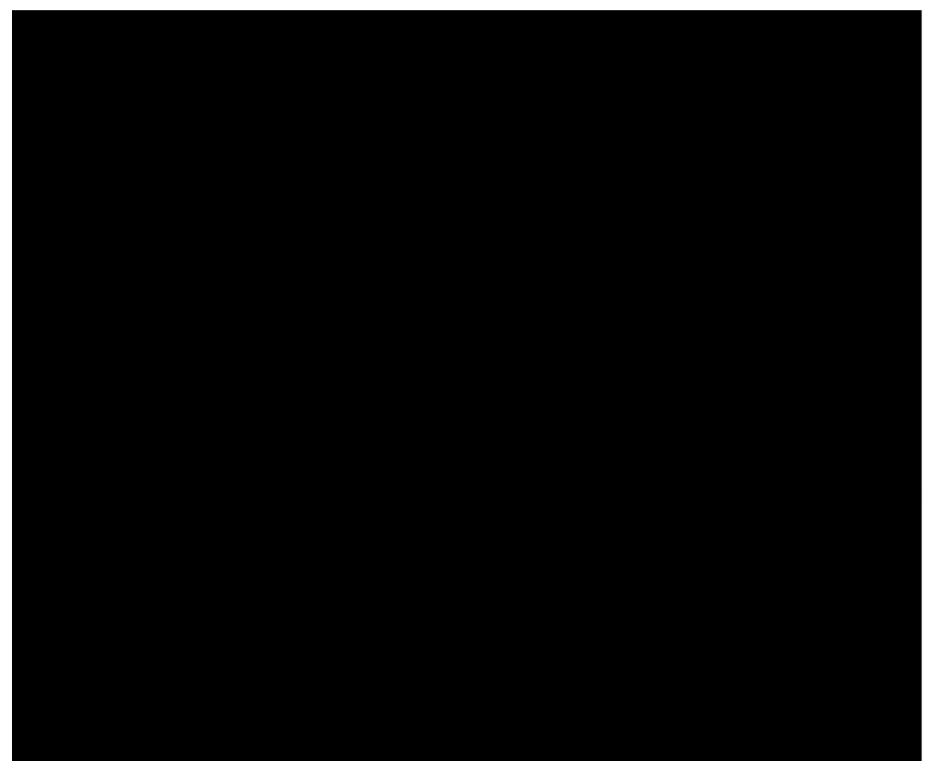

- 03 C
When viewed from the back, there is a column 3 cubes high closest to the viewer, without a cube to its right. This rules out A, B and D.
- 04 D
When viewed from the back, there is a column 3 cubes high in the middle. This rules out A, B and C.
- 05 C
When viewed from the back, there is a square face in the bottom left. This rules out A, B and D.
- 06 C
When viewed from the back, there is a square face in the bottom right. This rules out A, B and D.
- 07 B
When viewed from the back, there is a rectangular face 3 cubes wide. This rules out A, C and D.
- 08 C
When viewed from the back, there is a square face in the middle on the right. This rules out A, B and D.
- 09 A
When viewed from the back, there is a column 3 cubes high. This rules out B, C and D.
- 010 A
When viewed from the back, there is a rectangular face 2 cubes wide on the top with no other faces to its left or right. This rules out B, C and D.
